## Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

### Temporary Prohibition of Traffic

#### Sandy Lane in Chester

Notice is hereby given pursuant to the provisions of Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, that the Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council intend to make an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic on the following length of road, in Chester) to enable Bam Nuttall to carry out footway resurfacing, carriageway resurfacing and other preparatory works to be carried out.

- 1) Sandy Lane, Chester between its junctions with A51 Christleton Road and Dee Banks.

Nothing in the Order shall prevent driving upon the said lengths of road of any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situate on or adjacent to the lengths of road or in connection with agriculture, building construction, works of repair and the like or use in an emergency of vehicles for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes. A through route will not always be available and any vehicles not requiring access to properties on the length of road should use the alternative routes.

The Order will come into force on Monday 02 August 2010 and will continue in force for a period not exceeding eighteen months or until the works which it is proposed to carry out have been completed, whichever is the earlier. It is anticipated that the works will take approximately two weeks to complete.

#### Alternative routes for through traffic

Traffic should proceed via Chester Road; Caldley Valley Road; A5115 Whitchurch Road and A51 Christleton Road

Access for residents will be as follows:

Traffic from A51 Christleton Road end; Mortlake Crescent, Deefords Avenue and The Mount.

Traffic from Chester Road End; Walmoor Park and access for the river.

## Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

### Temporary Prohibition of Traffic

#### White Friars in the City of Chester

Notice is hereby given pursuant to the provisions of Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, that the Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council have made an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic on the following length of road, in the City of Chester to enable North West Gas Alliance to carry out gas main renewal works

- 1) White Friars at the junction of Bridge Street.

The Order will come into force on Monday 26 July 2010 and will continue in force for a period not exceeding eighteen months or until the works which it is proposed to carry out have been completed, whichever is the earlier. It is anticipated that the works will take approximately four weeks to complete.

#### Alternative routes for through traffic

Whilst this order is in place Article 2 of The City of Chester (Bollands Court – White Friars) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1982 will be suspended.

Traffic will not be allowed to exit White Friars at the junction of Bridge Street. White Friars from Bollands Court to junction of Bridge Street will be two way to allow exit via Weaver Street.

## Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

### Temporary Prohibition of Traffic

#### Chapel Lane in Chester

Notice is hereby given pursuant to the provisions of Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, that the Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council intend to make an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic on the following length of road, Chapel Lane, in Chester to carry out carriageway and footway resurfacing works to be done.

Nothing in the Order shall prevent driving upon the said lengths of road of any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situate on or adjacent to the lengths of road or in connection with agriculture, building construction, works of repair and the like or use in an emergency of vehicles for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes. A through route will not always be available and any vehicles not requiring access to properties on the length of road should use the alternative routes.

- 1) Chapel Lane/Saighton Lane, Saughton from a point outside Saughton Grange to its junction with Black Dog Lane

The Order will come into force on Monday 26 July 2010 and will continue in force for a period not exceeding eighteen months or until the works which it is proposed to carry out have been completed, whichever is the earlier. It is anticipated that the works will take approximately 14 days to complete.

#### Alternative routes for through traffic

Traffic should proceed via A41 Whitchurch Road, Platts Lane and Chapel lane
