Mae CynGOR Sir Ddinbych wedi gwneud Gorchymyn a fydd yn gwahardd unrhyw gerbyd rhag defnyddio'r hyd hwnnw o Riw'r Bigwn, Dinbych, yn Sir Ddinbych, sy'n ymestyn o'i gyffordd â Ffordd y Graig i'w gyffordd â Stryd y Dwr.

Y rheswm am y cau yw hwyluso gwaith adnewyddu prif gyflenwad nwy gan Wales & West Utilities

Y llwybr gwahanol sydd ar gael i draffig fydd ar hyd Stryd y Dwr, Ffynnon Barcer a Ffordd y Graig, ac fe fyddan nhw wedi eu harwyddo i'r perwyl hwnnw. Fe gynhelir mynediad i gerddwyr drwy gydol cyfnod y cau.

Fe ddaw'r Gorchymyn i rym ar Ragfyr 11, 2010 a bydd yn dal mewn grym am gyfnod o ddeunaw mis neu hyd gwblhau'r gwaith pa un bynnag yw'r cynharaf. Rhagwelir y bydd y gwaith yn cymryd oddeutu 5 wythnos i'w gwblhau.

NOTICE OF TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC ORDER
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14

Denbighshire County Council has made an Order which prohibits any vehicle from using that length of Beacons Hill, Denbigh, in the County of Denbigh, which extends from its junction with Ffordd y Graig to its junction with Water Street.

The reason for the closure is to facilitate renewal of gas mains by Wales & West Utilities.

The alternative route available for traffic is via Water Street, Barkers Well Lane and Ffordd y Graig, and will be sign posted accordingly. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the period of closure.

The Order comes into force on 11th December 2010, and will remain in force for a period of eighteen months or until the completion of the works whichever is the earlier. It is anticipated that the works will take approximately 5 weeks to complete.

Mae CynGOR Sir Ddinbych yn bwriadu, yn ddim cynt na 7 diwrnod o Ragfyr 9fed 2010 gwneud Gorchymyn a fydd yn gwahardd unrhyw gerbyd rhag defnyddio Hall Square, Dinbych yn Sir Ddinbych o'i gyffordd â Stryd y Dyffryn i'w gyffordd â Lôn y Parc a Bull Lane.

Y rheswm am y cau yw hwyluso gwaith ailosod prif gyflenwad nwy gan Wales & West Utilities.

Y llwybr gwahanol sydd ar gael ar gyfer traffig fydd drwy Stryd y Dyffryn, yr A543 Ffordd Rhuthun a Stryd y Parc a bydd wedi ei arwyddo felly. Fe gynhelir mynediad i gerddwyr drwy gydol cyfnod y cau.

Fe ddaw'r Gorchymyn i rym ar ddydd Mawrth, Ionawr 4ydd 2011 a bydd yn dal mewn grym am gyfnod o ddeunaw mis neu hyd gwblhau'r gwaith pa un bynnag yw'r cynharaf. Rhagwelir y cymer y gwaith oddeutu 8 wythnos i'w gwblhau.

NOTICE OF TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC ORDER
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14

Denbighshire County Council intends not sooner than 7 days from 9th December 2010 to make an Order which will prohibit any vehicle from using Hall Square Denbigh, in the County of Denbigh, from its junction with Vale Street to its junction with Park Street and Bull Lane.

The reason for the closure is to facilitate gas mains replacement works by Wales & West Utilities.

The alternative route available for traffic will be via Vale Street, A543 Ruthin Road and Park Street and will be sign posted accordingly. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the period of closure.

The existing one-way traffic order on Park Street will be suspended during the period of the closure

The Order will come into force on Tuesday 4th January 2011 and remain in force for a period of eighteen months or until the completion of the works whichever is the earlier. It is anticipated that the works will take approximately 8 weeks to complete.
