NOTICE OF TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC ORDER  
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14**

Denbighshire County Council has made an Order which prohibits any vehicle from using that length of Maes Hyfryd Denbigh in the County of Denbigh which extends from its junction with Smithfield Road to its junction with Maes Mathonwy

The reason for the closure is to facilitate flood alleviation works by McPhillips.

The alternative route available for traffic is via Smithfield Road, Middleton Road and Maes y Goron, and will be sign posted accordingly. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the period of closure.

The Order comes into force on 4th January 2011, and will remain in force for a period of eighteen months or until the completion of the works whichever is the earlier. It is anticipated that the works will take approximately 5 months to complete

NOTICE OF TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC ORDER  
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14**

Denbighshire County Council has made an Order which prohibits any vehicle from using that length of Tan y Gwalia Denbigh in the County of Denbigh which extends from its junction with Castle Lane to its junction with Broom Hill in a northerly direction for a distance of 210 metres

The reason for the closure is to facilitate works to new gas mains by Wales & West Utilities.

The alternative route available for traffic is via Ffordd Newydd, Castle Hill, Bull Lane, Hall Square, High Street Love Lane and Castle Hill, and will be sign posted accordingly. Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the period of closure.

The Order comes into force on 10th January 2011, and will remain in force for a period of eighteen months or until the completion of the works whichever is the earlier. It is anticipated that the works will take approximately 11 weeks to complete
