Notice is hereby given that Opus International has applied, on behalf of RNLI Trading Ltd, to the Marine Consents Unit (acting on behalf of the Welsh Ministers) for consents under section 34 of the Coast Protection Act 1949 and section 5 of the Food and Environment Protection Act 1985, in order to carry out marine works to support the construction of a new RNLI station at Porthdinllaen. An environmental impact assessment has been submitted for this project in accordance with the Marine Works (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2007.

The application and environmental statement are available for public inspection during normal office hours 9am - 5pm at Dwyfor Area Office, Ffordd y Cob, Pwllheli, Gwynedd, LL53 5AA. The documentation will be open to inspection for a period of 6 weeks from the date of this notice.
