GORCHYMYN CEFNFFORDD YR A494 (Y FFORDD YMUNO TUA'R DWYRAIN WRTH GYFNEWIDFA PARC GLANNAU DYFRDWWY, SIR Y FFLINT) (GWAHARDD CEBYDAU, BEICWYR A CHERDDWYR DROS DRO) 2014

MAE GWENIDOGION CYMRU wedi gwneud Gorchymyn o dan adran 14 o Ddeddf Rheoleiddio Traffig Ffyrdd 1984. Mae angen y Gorchymyn er mwyn gwneud gwaith cynnal a chadw arferol ar ffordd ymuno tua'r dwyrain cefnffordd yr A494 wrth Gyfnewidfa Parc Glannau Dyfrdwy, Sir y Fflint.

Disgwylir y bydd y gwaharddiadau canlynol, y codir arwyddion priodol ynghylch eu hyd a'u lled, yn dod i rym am 19:00 o'r gloch ar 12 Mai 2014 ac y byddant yn parhau mewn grym tan 13 Mai 2014 neu hyd nes y caiff yr arwyddion traffig dros dro eu symud ymaith yn barhaol.

Effaith y Gorchymyn yw gwahardd dros dro bob cerbyd, ac eithrio'r rheini a ddefnyddir gan y gwasanaethau brys ac ar gyfer y gwaith, beicwyr a cherddwyr rhag mynd ar hyd y darn cyfan o'r ffordd ymuno tua'r dwyrain o Gyfnewidfa Parc Glannau Dyfrdwy i'w chyffordd â'r A550.

Y llwybr amgen ar gyfer traffig yr effeithir arno o Gyfnewidfa Parc Glannau Dyfrdwy yw ar yr A494 tua'r gorllewin i Gyfnewidfa Queensferry, gan ymadael yno i ddychwelyd tua'r dwyrain a dilyn ffordd gyswllt yr A494 i ymuno â'r A550, y Welsh Road.

Ni fydd llwythi annormal dros 3 metr o led yn gallu defnyddio'r llwybr gwiriad a chânt eu dal yn y darn sydd ar gau a'u hebrwng drwy'r gwaith pan fydd hynny'n bosibl.

Dim ond yn ystod y dyddiadau a bennir uchod y disgwylir i'r Gorchymyn fod yn weithredol. Er hynny, bydd yn parhau'n ddilys am gyfnod o 12 mis ar y mwyaf rhag ofn y bydd angen ailamserlennu'r gwaith neu wneud gwaith canlyniadol oherwydd amgylchiadau nad oedd modd eu rhag-weld.

THE A494 TRUNK ROAD (EASTBOUND ENTRY SLIP ROAD AT DEESIDE PARK INTERCHANGE, FLINTSHIRE) (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF VEHICLES, CYCLISTS & PEDESTRIANS) ORDER 2014

THE WELSH MINISTERS have made an Order under section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, which is necessary to undertake routine maintenance works on the eastbound entry slip road of the A494 trunk road at Deeside Park Interchange, Flintshire.

The following prohibitions, the extent of which will be signed accordingly, are expected to come into force at 19:00 hours on 12 May 2014 and remain until 06:00 hours on 13 May 2014 or until the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

The effect of the Order is to temporarily prohibit all vehicles, other than those being used by the emergency services and for the works, cyclists and pedestrians from proceeding along the entire length of the eastbound entry slip road from Deeside Park Interchange to its junction with the A550.

The alternative route for affected traffic from Deeside Park Interchange is via the westbound A494 to Queensferry Interchange, there exiting to return eastbound and follow the A494 link road to join the A550 Welsh Road.

Abnormal loads over 3 metres wide will be unable to use the diversion route and will be held within the closure and escorted through the works when possible.

Although the Order is only expected to operate during the dates specified above, it will remain valid for a maximum period of 12 months, as a contingency, should the work need to be rescheduled or consequential work is required due to unforeseen circumstances.
