

**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 -  
SECTION 14(1)(A)****THE A5 AND A483 TRUNK ROADS (MILE END,  
SHROPSHIRE) (TEMPORARY RESTRICTION AND  
PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2014**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Secretary of State for Transport has made an order on the A5 Trunk Road at Mile End near Oswestry in the County of Shropshire to allow improvement works to be carried out to Mile End Roundabout.

The effect of the Order will be to –

- (1) impose a 50 miles per hour speed restriction on the -
  - (a) northbound and southbound carriageways of the A5 between its roundabout junction with the A495 and the B4580 and its roundabout junction with the A483 and the B4579 Shrewsbury Road (Mile End Roundabout);
  - (b) eastbound and westbound carriageways of the A5 from a point 360 metres northwest of its junction with the B4397, to Mile End Roundabout;
  - (c) northbound and southbound carriageways of the A483 between its junction with the A495 and Mile End Roundabout;
- (2) close –
  - (a) the lengths of A5 described in (1)(a);
  - (b) the eastbound and westbound carriageways of the A5 between its junction with the B5009 (Queen's Head Junction) and Mile End Roundabout;
  - (c) the northbound and southbound carriageways of the A483 between its northern junction with Maesbury Road and Mile End Roundabout;
  - (d) the layby situated adjacent to the northbound carriageway of the A5 approximately 325 metres north of the centreline of the Middleton Road overbridge; and
- (3) prohibit vehicles from entering or leaving -
  - (a) the A5 at its junction with -
    - a. the Aston Gates Junction, approximately 75 metres east of Shrewsbury Road; and
    - b. Shrewsbury Road;
  - (b) the A483 at its junction with Shrewsbury Road.

The work will be carried out overnight between 18:30 hours and 07:00 hours and is expected to start on Tuesday 1 July 2014 and continue for approximately nine months. The speed restrictions and layby closure will be in operation for 24 hours a day for the duration of the works. The Order will come into force on Tuesday 24 June 2014.

Vehicles being used for special forces purposes will be exempt from the speed restriction. Vehicles being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes will be exempt from the speed restrictions, closures and prohibitions. Vehicles being used in connection with the works will be exempt from the closures and prohibitions.

Diversion routes via Maesbury Road, Maes-Y-Clawdd, and the B4579 and vice versa; and the A495 Whittington Road and the B5009 and vice versa will be signed. Local diversion routes will also be in operation. Access to property will be maintained at all times.
