Mae Cyngor Sir Ddinbych wedi gwneud Gorchymyn a'i effaith yw:-

- 1) Gosod terfyn cyflymder 10 mya dros dro ar:-
(i) Trellewelyn Road, Y Rhyl o'i chyffordd â ffordd Rhuddlan i'r gyffordd â Phen y Maes.
(ii) Pen y Maes Avenue, Y Rhyl o'i chyffordd â Trellewelyn Road i'w chyffordd â Dyserth Road.

Bydd y cyfyngiad 10 mya yn gymwys pan fydd gwaith confoi mewn grym ar unrhyw ddiwrnod penodol.

- 2) Gwahardd pob cerbyd rhag goddiweddyd ar hyd y darn uchod o'r ffordd.

Bwriad y cyfyngiad yw hwyluso diogelwch y gweithwyr yn ystod y gwaith ail-wynebu gan Gyngor Sir Ddinbych – yr Uned Waith.

Daw'r Gorchymyn i rym ar 28 Mawrth 2015 a bydd yn parhau mewn grym am gyfnod o ddeunaw mis neu hyd nes y cwblheir y gwaith, pa un bynnag sydd gynharaf. Disgwylir i'r gwaith gymryd oddeutu 3 wythnos i'w gwblhau.

**NOTICE OF TEMPORARY TRAFFIC ORDER
DENBIGHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
TRELLEWELYN ROAD AND PEN Y MAES AVENUE RHYL
NOTICE OF TEMPORARY 10 MPH SPEED RESTRICTION AND NO OVERTAKING
ORDER
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14**

Denbighshire County Council has made an Order the effect of which is :-

- 1) To impose temporarily a 10 mph speed limit on :-
(i) Trellewelyn Road Rhyl from its junction with Rhuddlan road to its junction with Pen y Maes.
(ii) Pen y Maes Avenue Rhyl from its junction with Trellewelyn Road to its junction with Dyserth Road.

The 10 mph limit will apply when convoy work is in force on any given day.

- 2) To prohibit all vehicles from overtaking in the said length of road.

The reason for the restriction is to facilitate the safety of workmen during resurfacing works by Denbighshire County Council – Works Unit.

The Order comes into force on 28th March 2015 and remains in force for a period of eighteen months or until the completion of the works whichever is the earlier. It is anticipated that the works will take approximately 3 weeks to complete.
