

**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984-SECTION 14(1)(A)
THE A5 AND A483 TRUNK ROADS (MILE END, SHROPSHIRE) (TEMPORARY
RESTRICTION AND PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2015**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Highways England Company Limited (Company no.9346363) has made an Order on the A5 and A483 Trunk Roads, at Mile End, south of Oswestry in the County of Shropshire, to allow improvement work to be carried out at Mile End roundabout.

The effect of the Order will be to –

1. impose a 50 miles per hour speed restriction on –
 - a the northbound and southbound carriageways of the A5 between the roundabout junction with the A483 and the B4579 Shrewsbury Road (Mile End Roundabout) and the roundabout junction with the A495 and the B4580;
 - b the eastbound and westbound carriageways of the A5 between Mile End Roundabout and a point 360 metres south of the centreline of the crossroads junction with the B4397; and
 - c the northbound and southbound carriageways of the A483 between Mile End Roundabout and a point 720 metres north of the centreline of the junction with the A495;
2. close –
 - a the length of A5 described 1.a. above;
 - b the eastbound and westbound carriageways of the A5 between Mile End Roundabout and the centreline of the junction with the B5009 at Queen's Head;
 - c the northbound and southbound carriageways of the A483 between Mile End Roundabout and the centreline of the southern junction with Maesbury Road; and
 - d the layby situated adjacent to the northbound carriageway of the A5 325 metres north of the centreline of Middleton Road overbridge, north of Mile End Roundabout; and
3. prohibit vehicles from entering or leaving –
 - a the A5 at the junction with –
 - i the unnamed road leading to Aston Square; or
 - ii Shrewsbury Road; and
 - b the A483 at the junction with Shrewsbury Road.

The work will be carried out overnight between 20:00 hours and 06:00 hours and is expected to start on Wednesday 15 April 2015 and continue for approximately six weeks. The speed restrictions and layby closure will be in operation for 24 hours per day during the works period. The Order will come into force on 14 April 2015.

Vehicles being used for special forces purposes will be exempt from the speed restrictions. Vehicles being used by the emergency services will be exempt from the speed restrictions, closures and prohibition and vehicles being used in connection with the works will be exempt from the closures and prohibition.

Diversion routes via Maesbury Road, Maes-Y-Clawdd and the B4579 and vice versa (for A483 closures); and the A495, B5009 and Queen's Head Junction and vice versa (for A5 closure); will be signed. Local diversion routes for Shrewsbury Road will also be in operation.
