DENBIGHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
PUBLIC FOOTPATH NO. 29 RUTHIN
NOTICE OF TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF PEDESTRIANS ORDER
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14**

On 10th June 2013, Denbighshire County Council made an Order effective for a six month period which prohibits pedestrians from using Public Footpath No. 29 in the community of Ruthin.

The reason for the closure is to facilitate public safety due to a collapsed wall in the vicinity of Ruthin Castle.

The current Order expires on 16th June 2015, but to facilitate the continuation of the works this has been extended by a further 6 month period until 16th December 2015, with the approval of the Welsh Ministers using powers under section 15(5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991).

There is no alternative route available for pedestrians.
