

**GORCHYMYN (CYFYNGIAD PWYSAU 7.5 TUNNELL)
(OAKVILLE AVENUE DENMORE AVENUE AC EASTVILLE AVENUE, Y RHYL) CYNGOR SIR
DDINBYCH 201**

**DENBIGHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(OAKVILLE AVENUE, DENMORE AVENUE AND EASTVILLE AVENUE, RHYL)
(7.5 TONNE WEIGHT RESTRICTION) ORDER 201**

Denbighshire County Council propose to make an order under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, ("the Act of 1984") the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle or vehicle and load the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes from proceeding along the entire lengths of Oakville Avenue, Denmore Avenue, and Eastville Avenue, Rhyl in the County of Denbigh.

A copy of the proposed Order and a map showing the lengths of road to which the proposed Order relates, and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at Rhyl Library, Church Street, Rhyl, and at the offices of the undersigned during normal opening hours.

Any person wishing to object to the proposed Order should send a written statement of objection, stating the grounds on which they are made, to the Head of Legal, HR and Democratic Services, County Hall, Wynnstay Road, Ruthin by no later than 18th December 2015. Please include name and address details and note that all representations received may be considered in public by the Council and that the substance of any representation together with the name and address of the person making it could become available for public inspection.
